Player(s) (boy and/or girl) may play twice (two positions) in a match. Players may not play twice again until each player of the same gender on the roster has had a turn to play twice. **The second match that players play twice in must be MIXED DOUBLES.** This will eliminate the overuse of strong players. It is strongly advised that all players on the roster be given an opportunity to play.

Example: Players A B, and C are on a team. Player A plays Girls Singles and Mixed Doubles in the first match. Player A may not play twice again until players B & C play twice.

Instructions:

1. For each match, the team captain is to fill in the name of the player who is playing twice in the first match. If no one is playing twice, “non” is to be entered.
2. Present this form at check-in for each match.
3. Get signature of approval from tournament staff.
4. **Teams that do not have this for signed by an official may lose points!!**

“Pink Slip”

HERE’S HOW IT WORKS:

Purpose: This form is for those teams that have the bare minimum of boys and/or girls on a team, which is three (3). This slip will not allow the strongest player on the team, boy or girl, to play twice in **every** match. This form helps give everyone an opportunity to play twice in a match before that strongest player can play twice for the second time.

Instructions: Before each match, the team captain turns in his/her scorecard to the tournament desk along with this pink slip. The team captain fills in the blanks as to which player is playing twice for that particular match. If no one is playing twice, “**none**” is to be entered. Once everyone on the team has had a chance to play twice in a match, the cycle may start over again, in any order.

Every team captain has a pink slip and every team captain must turn this pink slip in to the tournament desk prior to each match! The tournament desk checks to make sure that a different player is playing twice a match. The pink slip must be signed/initialed before the match is put on court.

Justification: This policy will make for fair and equal play amongst the teams. It also allows for less pressure on each team captain from playing his/her best overall player twice each time.

*** The second time ANY player plays twice must be in mixed doubles***
