WHAT ARE THE MAIN COSTS & HOW TO LOWER THEM

- Sanction Fees
 - depends on level, but are relatively low
- Court Fees
 - depends what type of tournament
 - partnerships with local clubs or Parks and Rec
- Balls
 - buy in bulk, add to local provider order
- Awards
 - buy in bulk, add to local provider order
- Snacks/Drinks
 - local businesses, sponsorships
- Referee/Official
 - consider hosting tournaments that do not require a Referee
 - Juniors Level 7s and Junior Circuits
 - Adults Level 7s and some L6s
- Grants/Incentives (USTA North Carolina, USTA Southern and USTA National)



WHAT FORMATS SHOULD BE CONSIDERED?



- Level 7 (Adult & Junior)
 - One day, short scoring, non-elimination format
 - Great option for limited time and players (and you) don't have to commit a full weekend
- Level 6 (Adult & Junior)
 - Traditional 2–3-day weekend tournament
- Team Events (Adult & Junior)
 - You can decide the specific team format
 - Great option to maximize word of mouth marketing
 - Easy to schedule
- Junior Circuits (Junior)
 - 2-4 hours, half-day event, short scoring, non-elimination format
