Section/District Support

- Recruiting Help
- Distribution of Tools
- Monthly Support Calls
- Create SportsYou Platform Page
- Distribute Quorum/Kinetica/Tableau data as needed



National Support

- Creation of 'Starter Pack' of Tools
- Provide Bi-Weekly Success Stories, Tools, etc. to Specialists via SportsYou
- Build a National Advocacy Specialist Support Advisory Team (2 per Pilot)
- Provide Community Contact Leads via Quorum



Suggested Local Specialist Goals

- Sign up to be a Specialist
- Sign up for SportsYou
- Make Contact with Local Leaders
- Track Results of any Quorum Lead & Report Out
- Develop a 'State of Tennis' Annual Report for City Leaders & Staff
- Attend a Park & Rec Meeting
- Recruit Member of P & R Board or Staff to your BOD
- Invite Community Leaders to Tennis Events
