She held the #1 ranking in every level of junior tennis, which led to a spot on the Duke University women's tennis roster. As a student-athlete, she was ranked #1 in NCAA and named a two-time All-American.

After an outstanding college career at Duke, Kelly played in the Women's Tennis Association (WTA) and competed in all the majors. Her best win was against Flavia Pennetta (ranked #32 at the time).
